ADMINISTRATIVE OPERATING PROCEDURE

PROCEDURE TITLE:

Procedures for Procurement of New Instrumentation

APPLICABILITY:

Procedures apply to purchases of instruments by chemical control units at the Sea Lamprey Control Centre, Ludington Biological Station, and Marquette Biological Station.

PURPOSE:

To assure that all lamprey control units operate the same types of instruments, to limit the number of models in use, and to provide guidance to personnel responsible for procurement of instruments.

PROCEDURE:

- I. If a need for improved or upgraded instrumentation is identified, the program chemist should be consulted for technical expertise. The program chemist will make a recommendation on new instrumentation and consult with treatment supervisors and biologists.
 - A. Upon agreement to purchase a new instrument, one person from each station will coordinate field testing; and if ultimately deployed program wide, write an IOP for the program.
 - B. The IOP will be submitted and reviewed during the annual SOP meeting in December.

II.	New equipment and instrumentation can be purchased, but it cannot be used in field operations
	except in comparative work to assess the capabilities of the instrument until an Instrument
	Operating Procedure is in place.
